Community General Surgery PGY – 2

Goal: To develop the knowledge, skills, and conceptual framework necessary to provide excellent preoperative and post-operative medical care to patients with surgical problems and to assist general surgeons with common surgical procedures.

Objectives:

Patient Care

- I. Provide pre-operative and post-operative care for patients with surgical problems in both inpatient and ambulatory settings.
 - 1. Perform a complete history & physical examination, including gathering needed data and ordering appropriate diagnostic testing with attention to the potential surgical needs of patients.
 - 2. Develop differential diagnoses and management plans for a broad variety of ambulatory and inpatient surgical problems taking into consideration patient preference.
 - 3. Complete preoperative medical evaluations.
 - 4. Provide routine post-operative care for emergent and elective surgical conditions including post-operative wound-care..
- II. Perform common outpatient surgical procedures and assist in common inpatient surgical procedures.
 - 1. Effectively counsel patients on risks and benefits of surgical treatments.
 - 2. Obtain informed consent.
 - 3. Demonstrate proficiency in sterile preparation of self and patient for procedures and surgeries.
 - 4. Demonstrate proficiency in basic surgical technique, operating room conduct, and surgical assisting.

III. Coordinate patient care between medical and surgical teams.

1. Learn how to professionally and effectively consult a general surgeon and specialty surgeons when a medical patient requires surgical care.

Medical Knowledge

- 1. Interpret information from multiple sources, including the patient, family, and other health professionals as well as laboratory data and diagnostic testing to determine whether a patient would benefit from surgical intervention and/or consultation.
- 2. Anticipate potential outcomes (expected and unexpected) of surgical problems and procedures and initiate management plans for these outcomes.
- 3. Demonstrate correct interpretation of abdominal x-rays.
- 4. Manage patient, family and nurse phone calls regarding the pre-operative and post-operative care of surgical patients.

Interpersonal and Communication Skills

- I. Demonstrate effective interpersonal communication skills with patients, their families, and other healthcare professionals
- 1. Communicate information to patients and patients' families with attention to privacy concerns and healthcare literacy.
- Accurately and empathetically cousel patients on pre-procedure and post-procedure expectations, information, and instructions.
- 3. Write complete, accurate, well-organized notes that reflect a synthesis of relevant information from multiple sources in a timely manner.

4. Develop professional relationships with community surgeons and coordinate care of the surgical patient.

Professionalism

- I. Fulfill professional responsibilities, adhere to high ethical standards, and remain sensitive to patient populations
 - 1. Protect patient privacy in the clinic and hospital.
 - 2. Arrive punctually to sign out, rounds and other residency duties.
 - 3. Complete admission history & physical examinations, progress notes, and discharge summaries in a timely manner.
 - 4. Demonstrate emotional maturity, including respectful communication with patients and other members of the healthcare team.
 - 5. Identify limits of one's own medical knowledge and appropriately seek assistance when needed.

Systems-Based Practice

- I. Develop an awareness of the role of health care systems, and to utilize various resources to provide optimal care for their surgical patients in a cost-conscious manner
 - 1. Identify the role and scope of practice and work collaboratively with wound care professionals, and nutritionists in the management of surgical patients Advocate for patients with access-to-care issues.
 - 2. Work collaboratively with managers, discharge planners, and other providers to ensure optimal utilization of all system resources for surgical patients.
 - 3. Utilize consultants and ancillary services when medically appropriate.
 - 4. Utilize case management services and other available services to ensure that prior to procedures appropriate prior authorizations are obtained.
 - 5. Prescribe formulary medication when possible and medically appropriate to ensure that necessary medications will be obtainable by patients.
- II. Demonstrate an attention to patient safety.
 - 1. Recognize medical errors when they occur, including "near misses."
 - 2. Utilize available systems to report medical errors in an effort to improve medical care in the future as part of the culture of safety.
 - 3. Utilize appropriate and available protocols, including checklists and other error-avoidance strategies, to maximize patient safety.

Practice Based Learning and Improvement

- I. Continually assess surgical knowledge and practices and utilize clinical experiences to stimulate selfdirected learning
 - 1. Formulate relevant, searchable, clinical questions.
 - 2. Utilize evidence-based resources to investigate clinical questions that arise when caring for surgical patients.
 - 3. Utilize clinical practice guidelines when caring for surgical patients.
 - 4. Identify areas for further learning and improvement based on feedback and self-assessment.
 - 5. Demonstrate an attitude of self-improvement by seeking out and being receptive to feedback.
 - 6. Participate in the education of students and other members of the health care team.
